Throughout her collegiate years, she has served as president of the company and formulated designs for all clothing apparel, which includes polo shirts, hats, t-shirts and baby clothes. Her inspirational story and entrepreneurial spirit captured the hearts of many, landing Chelsea in the national spotlight.

She appeared on Dove Ramsey's television and radio show and also made a guest appearance on FOX & Friends. She was also featured in publications such as *Atlanta Christian Family Magazine*, *Seventeen Magazine* and *Ignite Your Faith*. In April 2008, Faithful Fish became the first Christian-based company to be spotlighted in *COSMOGIRL Magazine*. She is also featured in *Chicken Soup for the Soul Extraordinary Teens*, a book by Mark Victor Hansen that showcases successful young adults.

Such exposure has helped Faithful Fish enjoy a 68 percent increase in sales volume since 2008. However,

rather than hoarding all the money for herself, Chelsea donates 10 percent of all profits to an organization near and dear to her heart—Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA).

"The Christian market is a very difficult market to be successful in," she said. "I feel very fortunate that my company has experienced success. The company is not in debt, and I haven't had to take out any loans."

Even with the incredible demands of juggling college with running a business, Chelsea made the Dean's List in fall 2009. Having a learning disability and experiencing personal tragedies could not stop her from reaching incredible heights. She's a shining example to high school and college graduates alike that dreams can be achieved through strong faith and hard work.
